

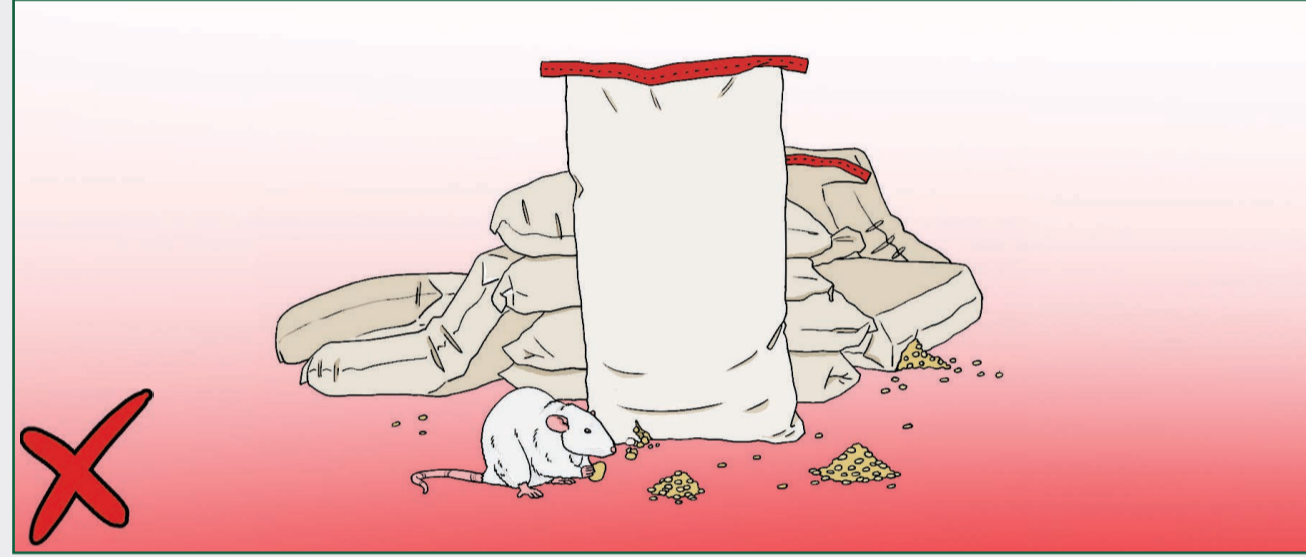
Biosecurity at Poultry Houses

1. Facilities

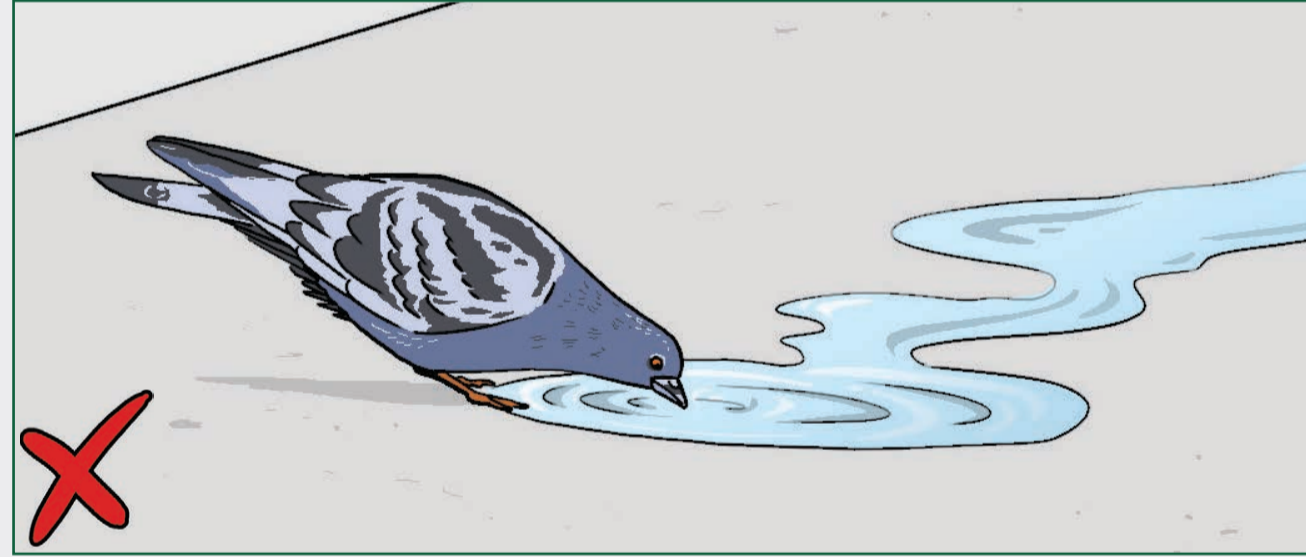
Must have a good fence to keep intruders and animals out.



Keep it neat and tidy so wild birds and rodents stay away.



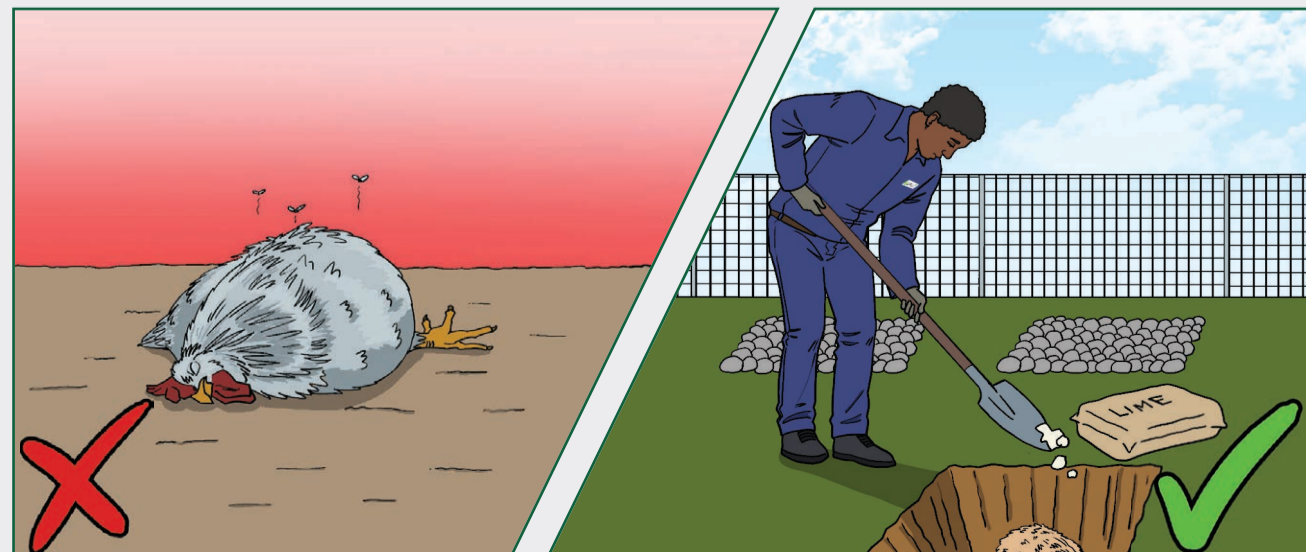
Don't have pooling or open water that attracts wild birds.



Houses must be **bird proof** so birds can't get in. Repair any holes immediately.

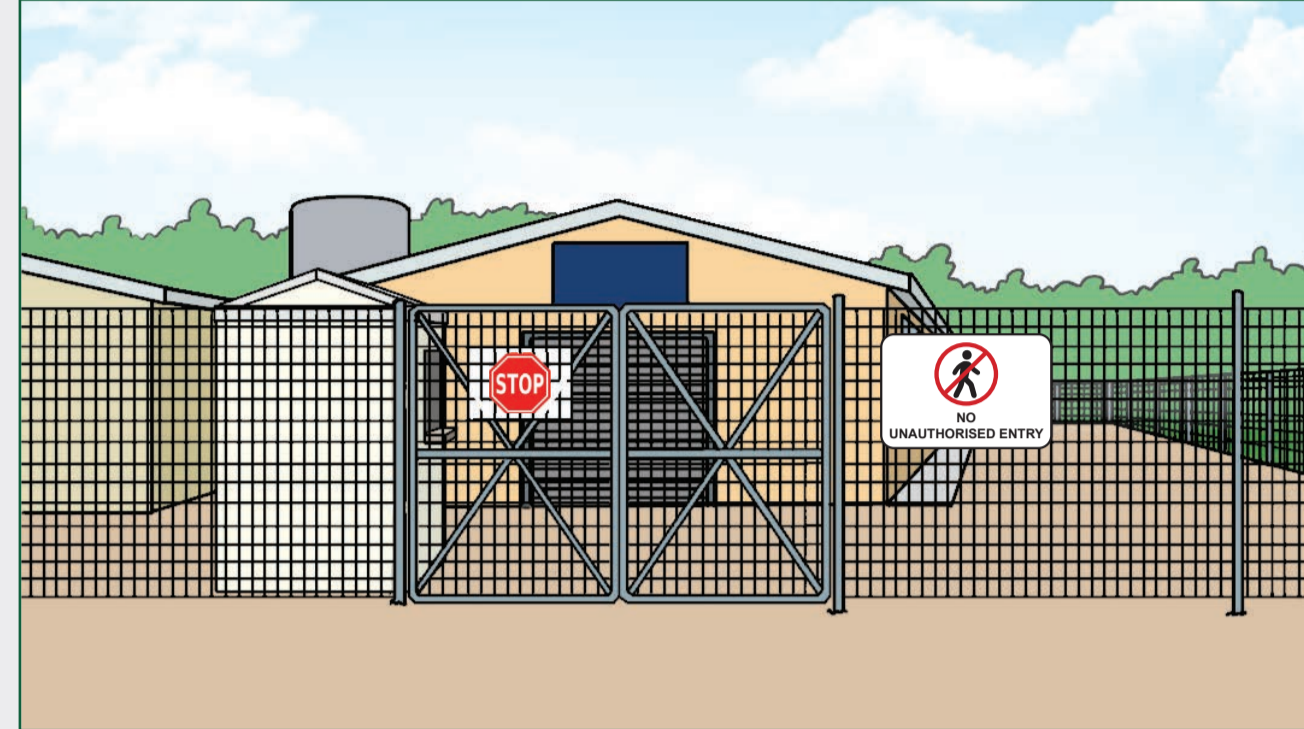


Bury any **dead animals** appropriately, with a closed burial.

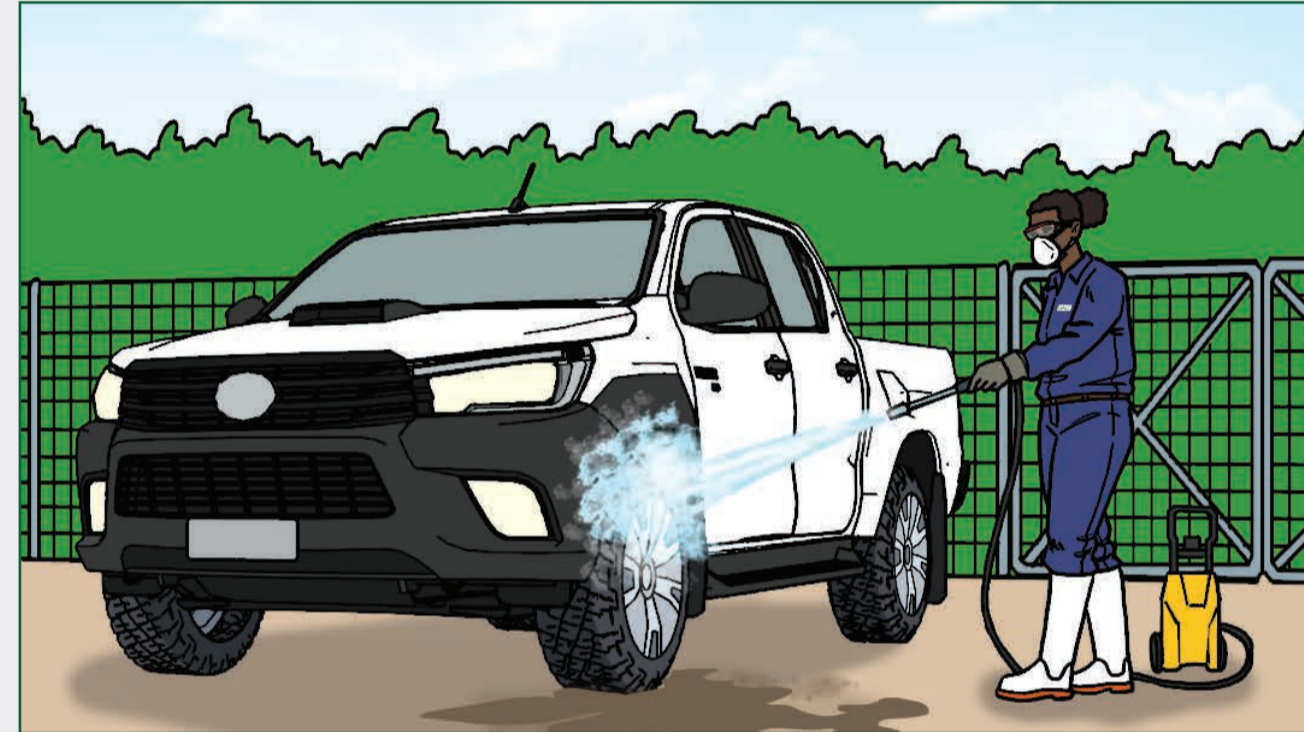


2. Access control

Only allow **authorised entry**.



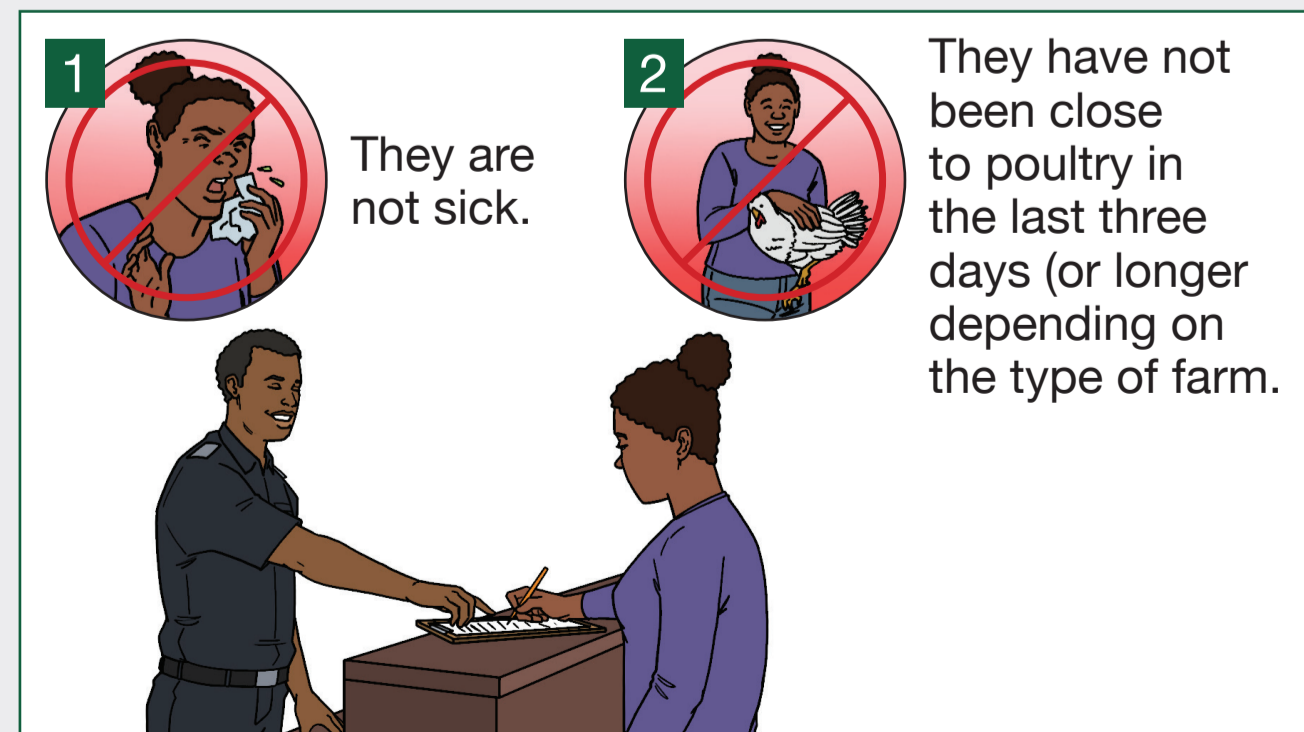
All **vehicles** must be properly disinfected before entry.



Tools and essential equipment must be **disinfected or fumigated** before allowed inside. This includes boxes, feed, materials and cell phones.

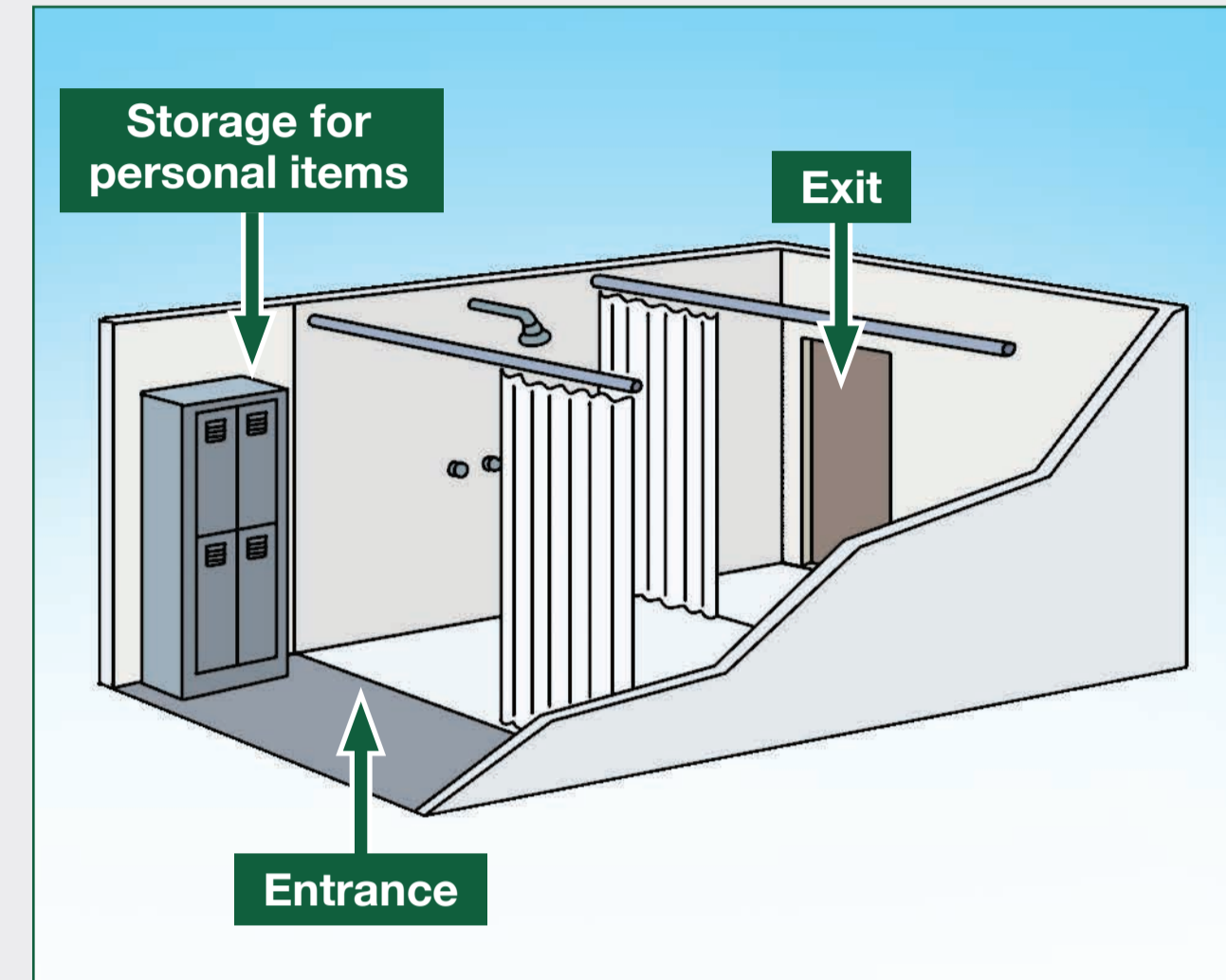


All visitors **must sign a health declaration** that:



3. Shower in and out

All staff and visitors **must shower before entry**. Take off clothes, including underwear, jewellery, watches and leave on the dirty side.



You must **shower** for at least **3 minutes** with warm water and soap and wash your whole body and hair.

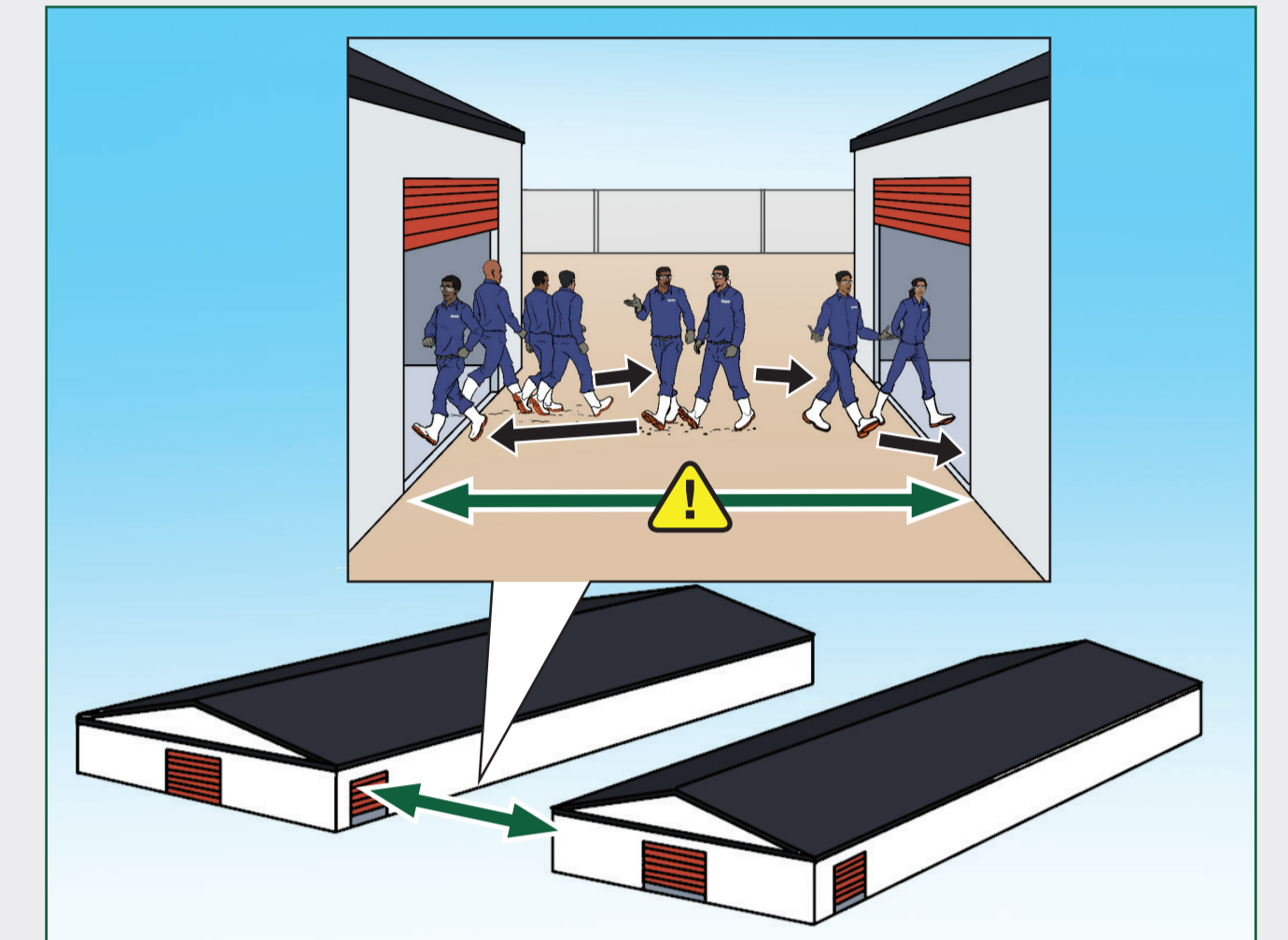


Put on **site specific clothes** including hairnet, boots etc. after the shower. Once you are on the clean side you cannot go back to the dirty side again.



4. Entering houses

Do not move inside and outside the house or **from house to house** without a good reason.



If you are moving between houses, you must use a **footbath** and **change footwear** before entering a house. For breeder farms, you often need to change your clothes completely.



Do not eat or drink in the houses.
